



## **Part Time Domestic Violence Facilitator (For Victims/Survivors)**

This position is responsible for facilitating support groups for victims and survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault, 1 night per week (with the possibility of additional days/hours), in Prince George's County. The essential functions and responsibilities of this position include:

- Provide immediate crisis intervention
- Develop and maintain monthly support group schedules
- Facilitate and oversee group sessions in accordance to professional standards
- Develop and maintain support group curriculum and supplemental resources
- Make appropriate referrals and provide linkage for additional services
- Prepare and maintain client and agency files, statistics, forms, and other records
- Identify current and future program needs and identify strategies to meet those needs
- Adhere to agency policy and procedures, including strict adherence to confidentiality and code of ethics
- Attend staff and/or supervision meetings as scheduled
- Work closely with the Violence Intervention Program's Victim Advocate
- Remain current in the field to include evidenced based assessment and treatment techniques, active and potential community stakeholders, and community resources to include training, seminars, workshops, and publications
- Represent the agency at external meetings, on boards and committees

### Performance Skills:

- Commitment to the mission, vision, and values of the organization
- Ability to work with diverse populations
- Understanding of trauma informed care
- Emotional maturity and sensitivity to the needs of domestic violence victims and survivors
- Knowledge of local resources

This position is for someone who loves making a difference in people's lives. Dependability is MUST!! Well developed time management, communication, and telephone skills. Domestic violence or trauma experience/training required. Previous experience facilitating groups with adults mandatory.

College Diploma is a minimum requirement in Counseling, Psychology, Sociology, Human Services, and/or Social Work. MSW, MA, MS in Psychology, Counseling or Human Services. Certification(s) and/or documented formal training (certification) may be considered. Priority will be given to candidates with a LGSW, LCSW, LCSW-C, LGPC, or LGPC, LCPC and LCPC-AS licensure.
