



# Domestic Violence Survivors Needed to Share Experiences of Partners' Arrests

The Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence is working with researchers at Arizona State University and Johns Hopkins University to improve the pretrial period for survivors of domestic violence. If **you are over the age of 18** and **your partner has been arrested since 2015** for harming you or your property or violating a protective order, you may be eligible to participate.

**Qualified participants will receive \$60 for an hour-long interview** about their experiences during the time after an offender was arrested until the conclusion of the trial or plea deal.
